I. Introduction:

The Gateway Education Association (GEA) funds scholarships for the intent to aid students in furthering their education. The GEA now offers two scholarships with each award set at \$1,500.00.

- II. Common Criteria for all GEA Scholarships:
 - a. Student must be a graduating senior from Gateway High School.
 - b. Student must be planning to further their education.
 - i. Accredited four year institution of higher learning.
 - ii. Bachelor Degree program designed for transfer to a Bachelor Degree program at a granting college.
 - c. Candidate must have at least a 3.0 GPA.
 - d. Candidate completes an essay (See Section VI).
- III. The GEA Scholarship I:
 - a. Given to graduating senior who is the daughter or son of a GEA member.
 - b. If there is no eligible applicant, the GEA Scholarship will be awarded to the third highest applicant under Section IV.
 - c. This scholarship is to be determined prior to the GEA Scholarship II. Unsuccessful applicants for the GEA Scholarship I become eligible for the second award.
- IV. The GEA Scholarship II:
 - a. Open to all graduating Gateway seniors.
 - b. Candidate intends to enter the field of education.
 - c. In case of a tie, preference given to a GEA member's son or daughter.
- V. Application:

The standard local scholarship application form issued by the Gateway High School Counseling Department will be properly filled out and submitted.

VI. Essay: (See Rubric)

1. <u>Title: "Discuss the teacher or educational experience which provided the most significant impact on your life."</u>

- 2. Format: 500 words or less (Typed, double spaced, 12 point font)
- 3. General Instructions: The essay value will be scored in the range of 0-10 using the rubric provided.

The essay values from each committee member will be totaled and averaged. The top score will be the winner. In the event of a tie:

- a. GEA member's son or daughter will be the winner.
- b. If no GEA associated candidate is available, the winner will be the candidate with the highest initial GPA.
- 4. Essay Rubric:
 - a. Mechanics: 0-3
 - i. Is the essay free of spelling and punctuation errors?
 - b. Support of the Essay Topic: 0-5
 - i. Does the essay focus on the topic?
 - ii. Are there clear and supportive statements adhering to the topic?
 - iii. Does the reasoning presented make sense?
 - iv. Is there a conclusion which brings the essay to an intelligent and logical end?
 - c. Overall Impression: 0-2
 - i. Does the essay demonstrate organization, effort, and clarity?
 - ii. Does the essay exhibit sincerity?
