Monroeville is a suburban community located in Allegheny County, fifteen miles east of Pittsburgh. Its 19.54 square miles of rolling hills has a population of approximately 35,000. It is serviced by the Gateway School District, which includes the boroughs of Monroeville and Pitcairn. Gateway High School is easily accessible by the Pennsylvania Turnpike, Exit #57, the Parkway (Route 376), Exit 84A from Pittsburgh to U.S. Routes #22 and #48.

#### FOUR YEAR COMPREHENSIVE HIGH SCHOOL

Gateway High School is a comprehensive four-year high school (grades 9-12). Its curriculum offers a variety of formal programs that meet the needs of students with college preparatory, business, or vocational-technical interests. We offer 23 Honors courses and 20 AP courses at Gateway High School. Honors courses are offered in the Business, English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Music, Technology Education, and World Language departments. Advanced Placement courses are offered in the Art, Business, English, Mathematics, Music, Science, Social Studies, and World Language departments. Several College in High School courses are offered. A variety of elective courses are offered for students to explore career interests. For gifted and talented students, there are two teachers that coordinate the AIM Program. Fifteen teachers coordinate the Special Education Program for students with special needs. Students are encouraged to participate in various extracurricular clubs and activities as well as community service. The interscholastic athletics program provides opportunities for all students.

The school year is divided into two semesters. Each semester is eighteen weeks with nine week grading periods.
