

LANDMARKS SCHOLARSHIP AWARD APPLICATION: 2024

Building relationships with capable young people who care deeply about the Pittsburgh region

- *Tell us about a place in Allegheny County that is important to you. Briefly explain the significance of the history, architecture, and/or landscape design of that place. Then, focus on how that place has affected you personally.*

If you can answer this question in an essay of between 500 and 1,500 words and meet the eligibility criteria below, then you may apply for this scholarship to help pay your tuition and book expenses at a college/university of your choice.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS AND CRITERIA

The recipient of the award will receive \$1,500 for his/her first year of undergraduate study to help pay tuition and book expenses. The scholarship award will be renewed each year, with a maximum grant of \$6,000, if the student maintains good academic standing and demonstrates involvement in campus activities. If, for any reason, the recipient leaves school, the remainder of the award will be forfeited.

The prerequisites necessary to apply for the award are as follows:

1. The applicant must live in and attend school in Allegheny County.
2. The applicant must be a high school senior **who has been accepted** to a college or university.
3. The applicant's cumulative Grade Point Average at the end of the first semester senior year must be 3.25 or greater (although exceptions may apply).
4. The award is based on a student's academic achievement; community service/work experience; financial need; and interest in the history, architecture, and/or landscape design of Allegheny County.
5. The applicant must not be related to Pittsburgh History & Landmarks Foundation board members, nor to board members of any of its affiliates, nor to any employees of any of those entities.
6. The applicant must complete this application, submit an essay on the theme stated above, and provide an official high school transcript, a copy of his/her college/university acceptance letter, and two letters of recommendation (including one from a community service representative). These materials must be e-mailed or postmarked by Tuesday, April 16, 2024, to the address given below.
