

What is **"Title I**"?

- Funds to provide programs to help children who are struggling in reading and/or math.
- Extra help (in addition to what they learn during math and/or reading time in the classroom)
- Funding provided under ESSA*
- Types of Programs:
 - Schoolwide all students
 - Targeted students identified for the program based on performance on assessments
- *ESSA = Every Student Succeeds Act





Beanstack





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
